3 HOURS OF POST CREDIT

Below 100 is a national law enforcement training initiative aimed at reducing annual line-of-duty deaths to fewer than 100, a level not seen since 1943.

Focusing on reducing preventable deaths through training on five core tenets: **wearing seat belts, wearing vests, watching speed, situational awareness, and remembering complacency kills**. Below 100 influences law enforcement culture by providing innovative training and awareness, through presentations, social media, and webinars on identifying the leading causes and current trends in preventable line-of-duty deaths and injuries.

Due Regard

2 HOURS OF POST CREDIT

At some point in every law enforcement career, you will be required to drive fast—**responding to emergency calls, navigating high-risk situations, or engaging in pursuits**. It's an unavoidable part of the job, and one of the most dangerous. Law Enforcement Officers are significantly more likely than the average citizen to be involved in a vehicle collision, making safe driving decisions critical every time you get behind the wheel.

The biggest threats to officer safety on the road are often not speed or traffic—they are over-confidence and poor decision-making under pressure. This course confronts those risks head-on by focusing on the **real factors that lead to vehicle damage, injury, and loss of life**, while equipping officers with practical strategies to stay focused, make sound decisions, and drive safely in high-stress situations.

4 HOURS OF POST CREDIT

★ TRAIN-THE-TRAINER ELIGIBLE

CLASS SIZE LIMIT: 18

LEADERS training provides hands-on driver instruction focused on improving **verbal commentary skills** for hazard identification, decision-making, and real-time observation. The course enhances situational awareness, communication, and focus under various driving conditions to help reduce vehicle-related incidents.

The program includes a two-hour classroom session covering narrative-driving concepts and Georgia emergency vehicle laws, followed by a 15-minute **practical driving exercise** in which students demonstrate verbal commentary techniques and receive instructor feedback. Upon completion, agencies receive all course materials for use in field training and annual refreshers.

Train-the-Trainer options are available to agencies with 45+ employees.

National Safety Council: Defensive Driver Training

4 HOURS OF POST CREDIT

Defensive Driver Training is a relevant, leading-edge course to motivate and educate employees to be safe, responsible drivers. You can trust the National Safety Council (NSC) to best train drivers to avoid collisions, crashes, injuries, or worse.

Having pioneered the nation's first Defensive Driving Course and having trained over 80 million drivers, NSC continues to be the most trusted name in defensive driving training in the country.

This course is recommended for those frequently operating motor vehicles as part of their regular work duties, and as a corrective action class for anyone who has had **an at-fault accident**.

Supervisor Liability

4 HOURS OF POST CREDIT

Strong supervision and **smart risk management** are the foundation of a successful law enforcement agency. This course shows how the intersection of **supervisory responsibility** and risk management strategies can significantly **reduce liability, prevent misconduct, and protect both officers and departments**.

Participants will learn how to identify potential risks, implement clear policies, and promote accountability to minimize operational errors, reduce workers' compensation claims, and strengthen overall agency performance. Through real-world examples and current law enforcement events, the course demonstrates how proactive leadership and sound decision-making can lower legal and financial exposure.

The course also provides an overview of **qualified immunity** and **summary judgment**, helping supervisors understand how these legal protections work—and why consistent supervision and constitutional compliance remain essential.
